Message from iEARN USA

For many of us here in the U.S., a trip to Pakistan is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. When the chance came for me to go to Karachi and participate in the Global Connections and Exchange Program's three-day workshop for teachers – I didn't think twice.

In my four days in Pakistan, I met extremely warm people and educators with a worldly view, who were eager to broaden the horizons of their students. The teachers displayed such enthusiasm for this project that I can't wait to see the contributions of their students. I feel extremely lucky to have visited a place so foreign to most Americans, and to be able to share my positive experience with anyone I meet.





A 3-day Journalism workshop was planned and conducted by iEARN Pakistan on 13, 14 and 15 December at a local hotel in Karachi. This workshop was the first event of the Global Connections, Journalism 2.0 program that iEARN Pakistan is implementing in collaboration with iEARN USA and Education and Cultural Affairs, US Government. The workshop trained a group of 23 middle and high school teachers to increase leadership skills, as well as personal and institutional ties and mutual understanding among stu-

dents and educators in Ecuador, Pakistan, Tajikistan, and Thailand and their peers in the United States.

"We are very excited about having our students to engage in meaningful inquiry through journalism projects", said an excited teacher at the closing of a three days teachers training in Karachi.

Ms. Amanda the Information Officer of the Consulate General of United States awarded the certificate of completion to all graduating teachers of this workshop.

Enhancing 21st Century Skills with iEARN Projects & Club Activities

iEARN Pakistan conducted a seminar on 'Enhancing 21st Century Skills with iEARN Projects & Club Activities' on Saturday 29, 2011 at Beach Luxury Hotel, Karachi. More than 200 teachers and students from different schools in Karachi and Hyderabad were invited to attend this event. This seminar was a kickoff event for the recently launched iEARN Global Connection and Exchange program, "Journalism 2.0: Empowering a new generation of Civic education leaders". This program will engage young leaders who are eager to understand and to have a voice in local and national events and communities. GCE is a collaborative program of iEARN programs in Pakistan, USA, Thailand, Tajikistan and Ecuador supported by the Education and Cultural Affairs of US Government. The day-long pro-

gram was also a sharing event for teachers and students of iEARN club schools. Other schools, who actively participate in iEARN projects and activities, were also invited to share their successes and challenges with others. The first half of the event included presentations by iEARN staff, followed by presentations of active iEARN member schools. Presentations made by students and teachers proved to be a good example of sustainability of iEARN projects in schools.

The second half of the event consisted of different breakup sessions. Six consecutive sessions were conducted which included 'Planning of iEARN Clubs and Activities', 'Youth Media', 'YouthCaN', 'Creative Writing' and 'Youth Volunteering and Community Service' etc.







iEARN Centre Islamabad hosts trainings...

iEARN Centre, Islamabad hosted "iEARN Beginners' Workshop" and "Youth Volunteering and Community Service (YVS)" trainings on 14 and 15 of October. A group of 10 teachers and 21 students participated in iEARN Beginners training, where as 11 teachers and 18 students attended YVS training. The participants of both the workshops belonged to different schools in Islamabad and Rawalpindi. The iEARN Beginners' workshop aimed to introduce participants to iEARN network and forums and get them involved in iEARN projects and activities. They were also briefed about iEARN school based clubs for students. The YVS training focused on engaging students planning and implementation of community service work.

iEARN Pakistan organized a couple of more workshops at its iEARN Centre Islamabad on November 11 and 12, 2011. The participants took great interest in the two workshops titled "Introduction to Adobe Youth Voices" and "Social Media and Web 2.0 tools", which provided them with new ideas of creating media and using social media and web 2.0 tools in education. The two day-long trainings included interesting activities, presentations, software demos and practice time for teachers. In first workshop, teachers learned to create media and planned to engage their students to express their thoughts and views using these 21st century skills. The other workshop introduced the use of Social Media tools in education and provided participants with an opportunity to exploring a variety of Web 2.0 tools that could be used in classrooms.

iEARN Orientation and YES Alumni support for Environmental Campaign

Yes Alumni Pakistan facilitated the students of The City School, Capital Campus Islamabad, who planned a community service event as a follow up activity of Youth Volunteering and Community Service workshop held on October 15, 2011 at iEARN Centre, Islamabad. Students and teachers of The City School planned a campaign against harmful effects of using polythene bags and to raise public awareness on the importance of recycling for a better environment. Students distributed paper bags to local shop keepers and pasted informative flyers at different places. On November 17, the YES Alumni team from Rawalpindi/ Islamabad again visited The City School, Capital Campus to conduct an orientation session about iEARN and iEARN Clubs to be formed in schools. They also helped the participants to better understand community service and volunteerism and shared their community service projects with them. The orientation was followed by a planting activity in the school premises where the YES Alums joined the Green Team of The City School and planted saplings.





Access Karachi students participate in 'Mega Event'

While the Access classes continued as usual at all the Access Centers, the highlight of the quarter was the 'mega event' held on 30 October, where all 1500 Access students assembled at the local hotel. The nearly 60 buses full of cheerful and excited youngsters, arriving at the hotel from 15 different parts of Karachi was indeed a breathtaking sight. As the day unfolded students presented their experiences with

Access in the form of reflections, presentations, video clips, poems, and skits – all in English! For most of the students this was their first experience making a stage appearance before such a huge audience. Participation in the mega event indeed gave a tremendous boost to their confidence. Program guests included Anthony Jones, the Cultural Affairs Officer at the US Consulate, Karachi, and SIE-iEARN Officials.

First Grand Event held by Access Quetta-Pishin

English Access Microscholarship Program Quetta-Pishin held its first grand event on December 12, 2011 at Quetta. 120 Access students from Quetta and Pishin participated in the event. The students shared their experiences of Access program and said that it is a life changing experience for them. They presented skits, made speeches and sang songs. The officials from Public Affairs Office of the U.S. Embassy, Islamabad and U.S. Consulate, Karachi were present at the event. They addressed the participants, met the students and talked to them. The students were very excited and happy to find the guests among themselves and shared their views with them. The event was organized on completion of the first module of the five-module English Access Microscholarship Program Quetta-Pishin. Access-Quetta and Pishin is the recently launched after school English proficiency program run by iEARN Pakistan. It engages 600 students from 6 different locations in Quetta and Pishin. Since 2010, iEARN Pakistan is already successfully running the Access in Karachi for 1500 students.

Beach Saving Efforts by YES Alumni and Access Students

December 31, 2011, last day of the year ended up leaving some unforgettable memories for the Access Students of "The Learning House (TLH)" as they did their Mega Service Learning Project titled 'SAVE OUR BEACH'. The participating Access Karachi students learnt to be an active and responsible citizen, take care of the beaches, they learnt to take responsibility and how to write reports. Most importantly, they learnt that trash kills marine life, and therefore periodic beach clean ups must be taken by every citizen.
